### Significant Investigation

From January 1, 2022, through January 31, 2022, Cedar Hill Police responded to 24 vehicle burglaries.

Most of the burglaries occurred in residential areas with one in three vehicles being unlocked at the time the offenses were committed.

It is significant that in 8 cases, firearms were the only item stolen from inside these vehicles. Only 6 firearms combined were stolen from vehicles in the preceding 3 months.

Please don't leave firearms and valuables in vehicles and always lock your vehicles when they are parked.
