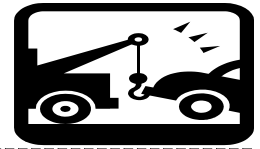

Red Light Cameras

On June 2nd, 2019, Governor Greg Abbott, signed a law prohibiting the further use of Photographic Traffic Signal Enforcement systems (Red-light cameras) across the State of Texas.

In compliance with the passage of this law, Cedar Hill ceased the use of these cameras effective on the same day.

We continue to encourage those traveling through Cedar Hill to use caution and safe defensive driving practices when passing through intersections.
