


### Around the Neighborhood

### Significant Incident

On Tuesday, February 11th, at 0800, E212, M212, BC210, and R211 were dispatched to the intersection of S. Joe Wilson and Bear Creek for a motor vehicle accident with entrapment. E212 and M212 arrived to find a 29,000-pound sewage tanker truck on its side, with the driver's head and arm pinned between the vehicle and the ground. E212's Captain quickly assessed the situation, and crews stabilized the truck to stop further crushing and prevent additional injury. Upon R211's arrival, a coordinated extrication plan was developed and executed. Using Paratech lifting struts at the front and hydraulic spreaders at the rear, crews lifted the vehicle approximately eight inches, freeing the victim within 28 minutes of the first unit's arrival. The patient was transferred to M212 for ALS care and transported to Methodist Central, where they were expected to make a full recovery with only minor injuries. The rapid, coordinated response, combined with the continuous professional training our crews undergo, ensured a successful outcome with maximum efficiency. We remain committed to providing the highest level of care to our citizens and all those who visit our great city.
