


### Around the Neighborhood

### B Shift Crews from Tower 211 and Medic 211 Perform Early Morning Extrication

On June 26th at approximately 1:30 a.m., B Shift crews from Tower 211 and Medic 211 responded to a severe motor vehicle collision. Upon arrival, they found one occupant trapped inside the vehicle and quickly went to work utilizing hydraulic extrication tools—commonly known as the "Jaws of Life"—to remove the driver's side door. This precise and efficient extrication allowed the crew to rapidly access the patient and begin providing critical care. The patient was safely removed and transported by Medic 211. Their calm professionalism and teamwork in the early morning hours reflect the high level of training and readiness our department strives for every day.
