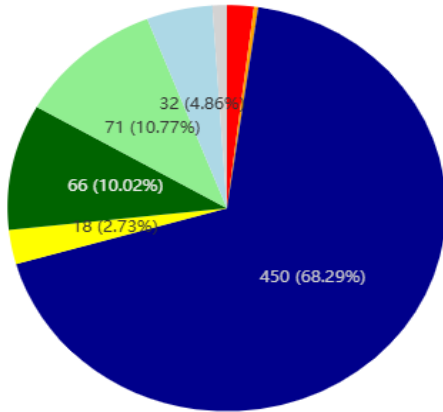
### Around the Neighborhood

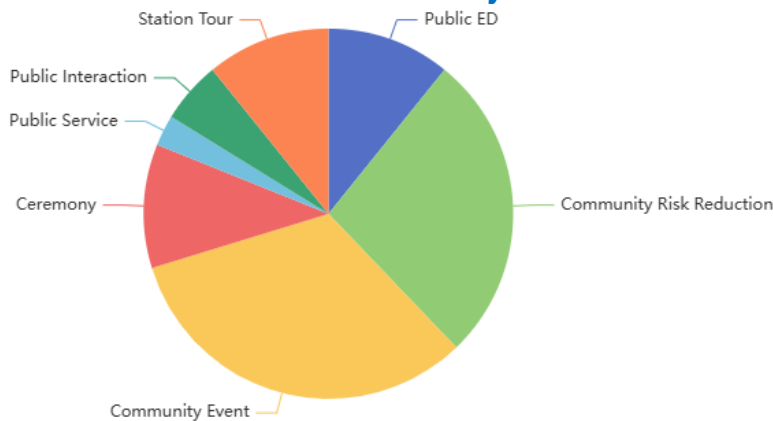

### Smoke on Talala Trail

At approximately 07:50 hours, dispatch received a report from a state park ranger indicating that a public restroom facility was on fire near Talala Trail, approximately 150 feet off the main road and behind campsites 290 and 292. The ranger reported visible smoke and flames, and initial attempts to extinguish the fire with a portable extinguisher were unsuccessful. First-arriving units were on scene by 08:03, confirming active fire and smoke conditions. Crews initiated a coordinated fire attack and containment strategy. By 08:14, the fire was under control. No injuries were reported, and no individuals were found inside the structure. Observations suggested the fire may have occurred overnight or in the early morning hours. The cause remains undetermined, pending further investigation.
