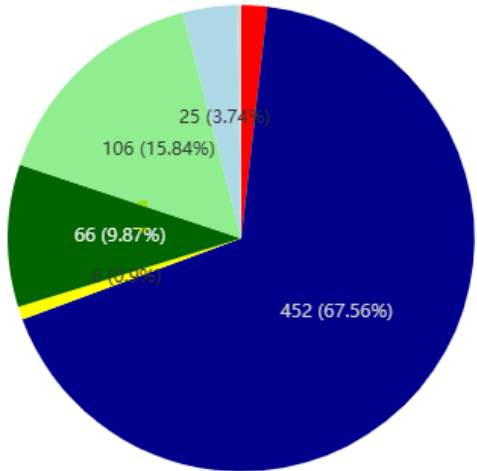
### *Around the Neighborhood*

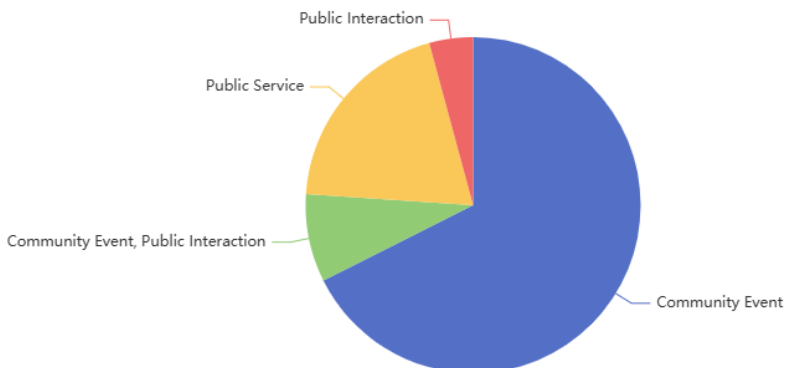

### *Quick Action Limits Loss at Hines Drive Fire*

On September 26, 2025, C-Shift crews responded to a residential structure fire at 1004 Hines Drive. First-arriving units encountered heavy smoke and active fire in the garage, extending into the attic of the one-story home. E212 quickly deployed a 1¾" handline and initiated an aggressive fire attack, while M212 established water supply and joined in suppression efforts. A coordinated primary search confirmed all occupants were clear. Thanks to the fast response, decisive command, and seamless teamwork, the fire was contained to the garage and attic spaces—sparing the majority of the home and personal belongings. This incident stands as another excellent example of how the Cedar Hill Fire Department's quick, aggressive action makes all the difference.
