
Around the Neighborhood

Cedar Hill Fire Department was proud to be a part of the largest multi-agency emergency response exercise ever conducted in North Central Texas, bringing together more than 80 local, state, and federal partners to enhance regional readiness. Our Technical Rescue Team and Ambus Medical Team trained alongside regional first responders in high-intensity simulations involving complex rescues, hazardous materials, and mass-casualty incidents. Training like this ensures we're prepared to respond effectively and work seamlessly with our regional partners when it matters most.



Garage Fire in Cedar Hill Contained

A garage fire at a residential property in Cedar Hill was swiftly contained early morning thanks to the coordinated efforts of multiple fire units from the Cedar Hill Fire Department. The incident began at approximately 6:53 a.m. when emergency services were dispatched following reports of heavy smoke and visible flames coming from a garage attached to a home. The resident evacuated with her children and waited outside in a vehicle. Units were dispatched and arrived on scene within minutes. Crews observed smoke emanating from the garage and initiated an offensive strategy for fire attack and primary search. DeSoto's E263 led the fire attack, reporting difficulty locating the fire due to heavy smoke, while other crews gained access to the garage and attic areas. Ventilation was completed and primary and secondary searches confirmed that all occupants were safely evacuated. E213 reported the breaker panel was shut off, and no gas was present in the structure. The fire was declared out shortly after, with crews conducting overhaul operations near the garage to ensure no hidden flames remained. No injuries were reported, and the cause of the fire remains under investigation.
